

At our annual meeting in January, we passed a deficit budget, but you can see here that thanks to the generosity of so many Elk River Lutheran Church members we show just a small deficit as of the end of April. The cold, difficult winter provided higher than normal snow removal and heating bills, as well as lower attendance in worship on some Sundays. However, overall attendance and giving have been very strong. So thank you!

ERLC Update On Capital Campaign

Last month we began celebrating our 10th anniversary as a church with a Combined Worship Service, Mural Dedication, and Downtown Block Party (I say began, because we hope to celebrate this milestone throughout the rest of this year!). We grounded that celebration in the phrase “Powered by Love,” a phrase that speaks not only to the original founding vision of Elk River Lutheran, but also to who we are still today. I am excited for the ways this capital campaign will help us further live into mission and make that original vision a reality.

Since the April 28th Congregational Meeting, when Pastor Blair Anderson of New Horizons Congregational Consulting, was hired, I have met with him, worked with the council to further flush out the campaign goals, and our capital campaign executive team has met for the first time. Members of that newly formed team include:

A major goal of this campaign is to pay down the debt we owe on this property, so that we can secure a mortgage with as low of a balance as possible. This effort frees up the general offerings received to continue and further the ministry of Elk River Lutheran Church. Along with tending to the debt, we also have some wonderful preliminary plans for ways to improve the building and help us better live into the space. There will be opportunities for further discussion around these goals:

- Immediate principal buydown
- Augment general fund monthly principal and interest payments for 36 months
- Remodel sanctuary space- improving aesthetics and functionality
- Improved signage and landscaping (with focus on Main St side of property)
- Enhance main entrance to improve welcome
- Additional principal buydown


In the coming weeks and months we will be working to recruit approximately 100 of us to serve on these nine teams:

- The Executive Team—a group of overseers who give guidance to the entire appeal process
- Advance Gifts—the team which helps to find some of the early leadership gifts
- Spiritual Life—the team which makes sure the entire campaign is bathed in prayer
- Arrangements—the team which provides great food, refreshments and gracious hospitality
- Messengers—the team which makes sure every single household is contacted by phone, not asking for money, but making authentic connections
- Communications—the team which makes sure we are getting on the radar screens of 5 unique generations with accurate information and inspiration.
- Young Disciples—the team which makes sure children and youth are included in this faith journey
- Congregational Events—the team which plans special worship experiences
- Follow up—the team which works with the consultant for the next 3 years—making sure the vision of the appeal is kept alive

It is an exciting time to be a part of Elk River Lutheran Church. We are celebrating an amazing ten years of life together and following God into this bold vision for our future. I ask you to pray for our church during this time and that you would prayerfully consider joining one of the nine teams mentioned above. Thank you for your love of this church and your willingness to live powered by love!


The Genealogy Group meets once a month to share family stories, share our discoveries and assist each other with research.



SCENIC ARTIST AND MURALIST

For 15 years Lili has built a business as a scenic artist and muralist, her most notable clients being Macy's special events (Minneapolis and Chicago), the Loews Hotel Minneapolis, Split Rock Studios museum services, a 2017 feature film ("Wilson"), and numerous public art commissions. Her murals are installed in businesses and organizations all over the country, while mainly concentrated in Minnesota.

Lili is a founding member and Vice President of the Guild of Scenic Artists, a non-profit working to foster community, provide education resources, and help the industry challenges of professional Scenic Artists.

She was featured on an episode of Pioneer Public Television's "Postcards", an award-winning art and culture program showcasing the people and

Payne is a friend of Taylor Quinn, the music director at Elk River Lutheran, and it was at a Christmas party she attended with Quinn that she met Mugaas and was asked about making giant-sized art in downtown Elk River.

She painted the Elk River mural between April 24-26. It took eight-plus-hour days and included at least one rain delay that prompted exploration of downtown Elk River. Stops included the Blue Egg Bakery for sweets, Aegir Brewery for some suds and Pompeii Pizzeria for dinner.

When she was painting, people often came up to ask her questions about what she was painting.

Payne designed and painted the colorful mural on the east side of Elk River Lutheran's building, which can be seen from a distance for much of the downtown's foot traffic.

Its colors and lines include messages of inclusiveness with the river running through it.

WORSHIP IN 7 MOVEMENTS

Do you ever notice there are four sections our worship services: “The Gathering of God’s People”, “The Word of God Proclaimed”, “Sharing & Receiving the Gifts of God”, and “The Sending of God’s People”. I recently stumbled upon a Facebook post that explained the purpose of those sections and why each is important. I find knowing these purposes gives more meaning to the spiritual practice of attending church. I hope it brings you a deeper understanding of what we do every week.

Below are the headings that appear in our bulletins with the items we move through within each service. The additional information is taken from an article called “Worship in 7 Movements” by Matthew Anderson, a Lutheran Pastor in Victorville, CA. He explains how each numbered item accomplishes a meaningful purpose in the worship service. Check it out, and may it enrich your experience every Sunday this summer.

The Gathering of God’s People

1. “Welcome” and the “Gathering Hymn/Song”
We Gather: Intentionally calls the assembly to worship.
2. “Confession and Forgiveness”
We Express Our Need for God: Includes a prayer for God’s presence and/or confession of sin.
3. “Song of Praise”
We Sing Christ’s Praises for God’s glory revealed in Jesus, the fulfillment of our need.

The Word of God Proclaimed

4. “First & Second Reading(s)”, “Gospel Acclamation (8:15 am service)”, “Children’s Message” and “Sermon”
We Hear God’s Word through hearing the Gospel. Our faith is nourished.

Sharing & Receiving the Gifts of God

5. “Hymn/Song of the Day”, “Bidding Prayers”, and “Offering”
We Respond to God’s Word. We proclaim/respond to God’s Word as an assembly; offer ourselves in response.
6. “Words of Institution”, “The Lord’s Prayer”, and “Communion”
We Receive Christ’s Presence. Through eating and drinking, God’s grace works in us.

The Sending of God’s People

7. “Blessing of Congregation”, “Sending Hymn/Song”, “Sending Dialogue”
We Are Sent. We go to participate in God’s mission in the world.


