

Endowment Fund

In 2016, through the generosity of the Patten Family, the Elk River Lutheran Church Endowment Fund was established. The Mission Endowment Task Force created the Mission of the ERLC Endowment and the ERLC Mission Endowment Committee was approved by the ERLC Congregation at the 2018 Congregational Meeting.

Grants will be awarded by the ERLC Mission Endowment Committee each year to mission areas that align with the vision of the Endowment's mission. A Mission Endowment Fund Application form and Guidelines are available on the ERLC website along with a brochure. The Mission Endowment Committee meets at least quarterly or more often as needed. A grant of \$1,000 was recently awarded to Lutheran University Nigeria through the Minneapolis Area Synod of the ELCA. Plans are to host *Financial Peace University* with Dave Ramsey in January of 2024.

The Endowment Fund provides ERLC members and friends with the opportunity to make charitable gifts to ERLC and to have the earnings from those gifts fund future donations for scholarships, community outreach, and ELCA mission work. Starting January 18th 2024

Elk River Lutheran Church, with the financial support of our Mission Endowment Fund, is excited to offer this Financial Peace University class at a discounted rate of *\$60 and provide free childcare during the class.

Financial Peace University is the nine-week class that teaches you the step-by-step plan to win with money and gives you all the tools you need to work it. Once a week for nine weeks, you'll watch a video lesson (each one is about an hour long) and then meet as a group for discussions and activities that drive each lesson home. (Aka, the most transformative part of FPUI)


Your Council thanks you for your support – support coming in so many ways! Twice in the past 8 months we asked for cash flow assistance.
