

I needed some professional downtime, whittling down my extensive task list and thinking about the next program year. It was much needed and well-appreciated. It was a peaceful summer on the chancel as well. I am extremely grateful for all the musicians who signed up to lead music with me and Lisa. It was so nice having you there on Sunday morning without a week of rehearsals. You came, you led, and we all enjoyed it. Thank you. You are a gift.

With no rehearsals to lead and no special events to make happen, I really did enjoy time thinking about the music ministry and putting together plans for each ensemble. All four of them will start right after Labor Day: Riverside Ringers Handbell Choir, Instrumental Ensemble, ERLC Choir, and the Worship Band. 

ERLC Church Council is proud and excited to announce the creation of the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion (DEI) and Social Justice task force. The task force will comprise of 5-7 people. Regarding the Task Force, below are the overall roles and immediate tasks:



- Rewrite our RIC Affirmation Statement and to come alongside Council to determine an annual monetary commitment to Reconciling Works. Those are both new requirements to maintain our RIC status.
- Think bigger..... help to set a course for DEI and SJ within our congregation. Search for ideas and ways to celebrate, educate and engage as a congregation around these important topics. Help to chart a course for the future of DEI and SJ at ERL for years to come.

The time commitment for the task force is September 2023 through January 2025. With meetings approximately once every 2-3 months, for

approximately 60 to 90 minutes. The TF will report and work directly with the council. Jeff Schrock has volunteered to be the council liaison for the task force.

Quilting 10th Anniversary

September 24, 2013 the quilting group met for the first time and tied their first quilt. Pastor Cynthia Ganzkow-Wold mentioned to Pastor Phyllis Scroggins that she should start a quilting group for Lutheran World Relief. Phyllis volunteered and put out a sign up sheet for interested quilters.

September 24, 2023 we celebrate 10 years of quilting and 10 years of our wonderful congregation supporting us with: fabric, sheets, thread, irons, cutting mats and table, scissors, rotary cutters, some sewing machines and cabinets, a batting roller, an extended topper for ironing board, and cash donations for supplies, batting and shipping. At this time we have made:

- Lutheran World Relief: over 700 quilts; plus 362 School Bags
- CAER: 50 bags
- Lutheran Social Services-MN Refugee Services: 10 Quilts (started in 2023)
- Graduating Seniors: 25 quilts

The LWR quilts and school kits have been shipped to all parts of the world. In 2023, we expanded our reach locally by giving 2 quilts a month to Lutheran Social Service Refugee Program.

A factory blanket will keep you warm, but an LWR quilt will also warm a person's heart and nurture their spirit.

We appreciate and thank our congregation.

Generosity Team

The **Generosity Team** is a new team with old roots. The Generosity Team replaces the Stewardship Committee. The decision to change the name was based on a recognition that the term "stewardship," which has a long, historic meaning in our church, may not be as easily understood by new members or by others unfamiliar with the term. By contrast, the word "generosity" likely has a more universal meaning for most people, and may therefore be more easily understood.

The name change also comes with a somewhat different change of focus. In the past, we have largely focused on a period of time, usually in the fall, when we conduct an annual stewardship campaign. We will continue to give special attention to this period. 

Financial Report – Summer 2023

Your Council and I thank you, the people of Elk River Lutheran Church, for your generosity. Your financial support is vital to the mission of ERLC and our Synod.

The Council has been monitoring our church offering income and our expenses. The chart below shows a mixed bag, with actual income being somewhat less than budgeted, and expenses outpacing our budget. We expect the gap to close somewhat over the next couple of months, however, some modest cost cutting may be required.

We were fortunate to receive some federal financial reimbursement due to our retaining employees through the pandemic. The Council is considering options for this money, including Benevolence payment to the Synod, an Audit of our accounting system, a deferred maintenance fund, and additional Reserve Funding.

As you can see in this publication, ERLC is a vibrant faith community with so much happening at all levels. We hope this community will support our ministry together, not only with our financial giving, but also with our treasure of time and talents.
