

Pastor Nathan's Message

Dear Members and Friends of Elk River Lutheran,

As this newsletter goes out I am preparing for my upcoming sabbatical. I will be on sabbatical leave from June 5 through September 5. A sabbatical is meant to be a time of rest and renewal, where the pastor can focus on their personal growth and relationships.



Sabbatical policies, like Elk River Lutheran's, acknowledge the toll the busy, on-call nature of church work takes on a pastor and their family, and provides this intentional time of sabbatical as a counterbalance.

I am very excited and grateful for this opportunity. The theme for my sabbatical is a little strange (but you've known me long enough now to know that it's probably fitting). It is Stand-Up and Preach. I will spend intentional time with my family, including an 8000-mile road trip visiting family and friends, practice stand-up comedy, and explore the strategies, benefits, limitations and pitfalls of comedy in preaching.



For the study of comedy, I plan to read a number of books that explore comedy and specifically comedy in preaching (yes, such books do exist!). I'll also be interviewing a number of funny pastors about their experience with using humor in preaching. Many times, throughout my almost seven years at Elk River Lutheran they've seen me pulled away to meetings or pastoral needs that arise. So, to have this uninterrupted time will be a gift.



I am so grateful for these years of life and ministry together at Elk River Lutheran. We've done a lot in this time, including defining our place as a prominent downtown neighbor, tagging ourselves as the church "Powered by LOVE," combining a meal and worship into Dinner Church, taking on a couple of successful capital appeals, moving worship online and navigating a global pandemic, and completing a major building project. I'm not taking credit for any of these things, because we did them together, which is what has made this time such a joy.





Besides these major happenings there are thousands of smaller, more personal, experiences. I thank you for welcoming me as pastor into your lives during some of your greatest moments of joy and some of your greatest heartaches. Serving here has been, and continues to be, a privilege, and now I thank you for this time to step away. My last Sunday before sabbatical will be June 4th, which will also be our formal Dedication and Celebration of our Sanctuary building project. Please join us for this celebration.



Pastor Anne and the rest of the staff will be stepping up to fill in for my absence this summer and we will also have the opportunity to welcome several interesting and gifted guest preachers. Summer is typically a less demanding season at the church, and I hope that will be the case this year.

I look forward to coming back in the fall revitalized and ready for many more years together as we continue to live out this mission together:
