May 5 - Forgiveness is a Strange Thing

CONNECT

Spend some time checking in. What are highs and lows since you last met? How can your group members pray for and support each other this week?

GROW

- Who has modeled forgiveness for you (either by what to do or what not to do)? What have you learned from them?
- Put these in order of easiest to forgive to hardest to forgive: your loved ones, your enemies, and yourself. Why did you choose that order?
- Instead of “enemies,” think about the people who disagree with you or come against you, the people who are just difficult to deal with, or the people who have offended you. What does forgiveness look like for you in regard to these people? How can the Kingdom of God be made known in your daily life?
