The Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross is a devotional practice that consists of 14 stations, each one standing for an event that occurred in the passion of Jesus. The stations grew out of imitations of *Via Dolorosa* in Jerusalem which is believed to be the actual path Jesus walked to Mount Calvary. The object of the stations is to help make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the *Passion of Christ*. Art, combined with literature, prayer and reflection assist us as we work our way through this devotion.

14 Stations of the Cross

1. Jesus is condemned to death
2. Jesus takes up his Cross
3. Jesus falls a first time
4. Jesus meets his afflicted mother
5. The Cross is laid on Simon of Cyrene
6. A woman wipes the face of Jesus
7. Jesus falls a second time
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
9. Jesus falls a third time
10. Jesus is stripped of His garments
11. Jesus is nailed to the Cross
12. Jesus dies on the Cross
13. The body of Jesus is placed in the arms of His mother
14. Jesus is laid in the tomb

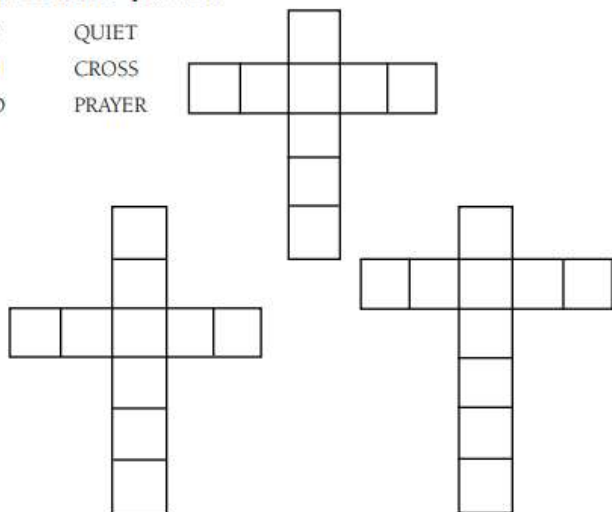
The service will be displayed on the screen in front of the church as we dim the lights in the sanctuary. As the service ends, please leave in silence.
