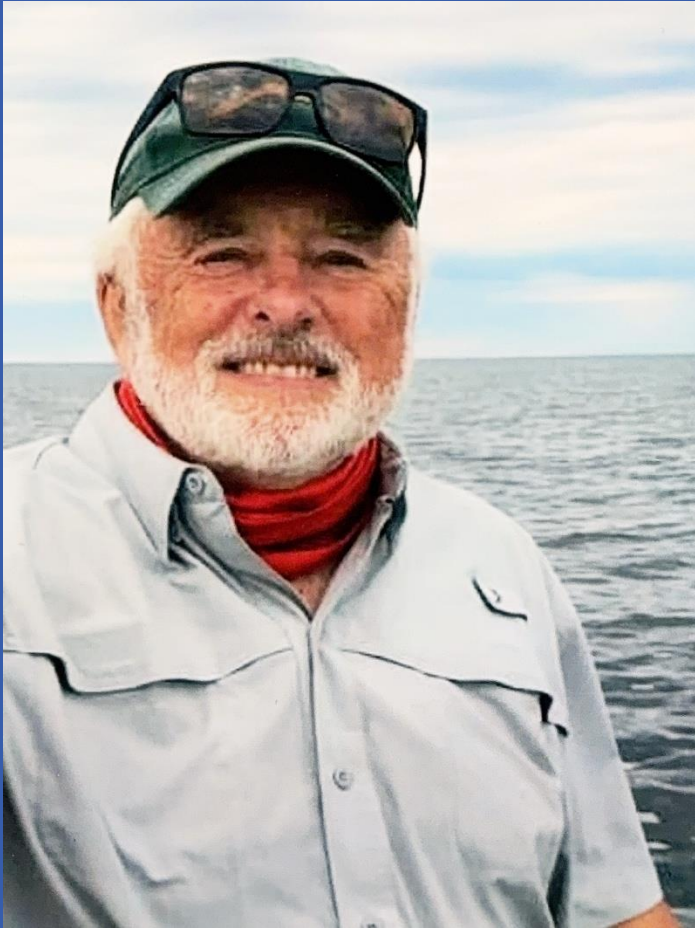

IN MEMORY OF STAN



Stan and twin brother Steve were born in December of 1943. They resided in North Minneapolis and moved to Brooklyn Center around 1950. Diane was also born in December of 1943 and lived in North Minneapolis. They were in kindergarten together and raised in

the same church, thus they were in many Sunday school classes and confirmation together.

Stan and Diane married in 1966 but weren't blessed with any children until 1972 when they adopted Tenise, Darrell was born 6 weeks later in January of 1973, Kim arrived in June of 1974, we fostered Teri who came in 1975 and Jerod was born in 1976. Those days were busy.

Stan taught Special Education in Windom, Minnesota for two years and then moved up to the cities where he taught in the Robbinsdale School District for 25 plus years. He then moved to Princeton, Minnesota where he was Principal of the Middle School until he retired. He sold real estate for five years, and then worked at Cabela's for five years.

At age 70 he decided to retire again.

Stan was always a bow hunter, he loved bird hunting with one of his dogs, and he enjoyed fishing. He spent many years teaching his three sons to hunt, fish and camp.

Today they are avid hunters and fishermen. Stan has now joined his hunting team of Vern, Shel and brother-in-law Art for their next great hunting adventure in heaven.

He struggled to hear therefore full attention was necessary. Within the last five years he took up downhill skiing, wood carving and painting.
